Msgr. Karl Korner Month of May, Mary's Month

Mother Angelica died on Easter Sunday of this year at the age of 92. Too little was written about this holy woman religious, and I must say, shame on the many "Catholic" publications who put little or nothing about the life and accomplishments of this living woman/religious Saint!

That being said, Mother was, without a doubt, the most influential Catholic television personality of our time. While Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen was the first clergyman to put his imprint on television, Mother Angelica succeeded in a way no one else did: She created the first Catholic media empire, the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN), and she did it against all odds.

Mother Angelica carried many crosses. She came from a dysfunctional family, suffered a myriad of physical ailments, was shot at by the KKK for ministering to African Americans in the South during the 1960's, fought with elites inside and outside the Catholic Church, and was ridiculed by those who objected to her orthodoxy. But she not only persevered, she triumphed!

Courage was her quintessential gift, refusing to buckle in the face of adversity. That she did so without ever losing her grand sense of humor made her all the more special. Her laughter, her smile, her radiant personality—these are qualities that touched millions, including those who only knew her through television. Concretely, I know for certain for the last 30 years my own parents in their 90's have watched and are still watching "Mother Angelica EWTN" and being home bound, can listen to the Holy Mass daily, hear the great speakers that are featured, and all the Papal masses on that legendary Catholic show. Let us not forget that daily, Mother always said the Rosary with her television audience, and I firmly believe, that it was because of the honor given to our Blessed Mother in this daily Rosary that made this Catholic broadcast not only legendary, but I believe will one day be part of Mother Mary Angelica's canonization process. Mother should be placed along with Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, Mother Cabrini, and the recent candidate for canonization, African American priest Father Augustus Tolton who laid the Catholic foundations in this country through their tireless evangelization efforts.

Mother Angelica may you rest in Peace and pray for all of us who remain.

Food Pantry 2016: We have had 318 visits to our Food Pantry so far this New Year. We have registered 34 new families. We will continue to service Beltsville, Calverton, College Park, Laurel and some Adelphi, Greenbelt and Hyattsville area families who have been coming to us for several years, as long as our food supply and monetary donations from this generous parish continue as they have been.

Current Pantry Stock: Due to a tremendous response to the Lenten Food Collection from our parishioners, our school parents, the community, the Knights of Columbus 2809, Holy Redeemer Parish in College Park and St. Anselm's Abbey in NE Washington DC, we have a huge supply of canned vegetables, pasta, soup, canned beans (other than baked beans), mac 'n' cheese, tuna and toilet tissue. Our ability to store all of the donations has become an issue, but one that we consider a blessed one. We will keep you updated as our supplies need to be replenished. School vacations and the summer months will be here before we know it.

Gift Card Donations: We are always in need of ALDI, Costco, CVS, Dollar Tree, Giant, Rite Aid, Safeway, Sam's, Shoppers and Shop Rite Gift Cards in order to help keep our pantry shelves well stocked.
