My fellow parishioners,

It is with a bit of sadness that we say goodbye to a "Good and Faithful servant of God", Fr. Paul Czarnota, who rendered distinguished service to both St. Joseph Parish and Regional school!

Fr. "Paul" as he is affectionately called, engineered a phenomenal Christian- game program, which all children were invited to play. These games allowed the children to use thinking skills which sharpened their academics, and the students had a lot of fun playing these games. What I felt was unique is that children actually wanted to stay after school to play these mind enriching games.

At the same time Father Paul was not only working with the children after school but also taught every week in the school religious education to all grades. He went well above this effort and developed a required religious education curriculum for the middle school as required by the Archdiocese of Washington. As this dedicated Priest was accomplishing these great Spiritual Works of Mercy, it allowed me to fix water main breaks, leaking toilets in the school, and the many other maintenance problems that still haunt us at St. Joseph's.

I cannot tell you how many parents in the school and parishioners have asked me how I can keep Fr. Paul here at St. Joseph? Well, I don't have a miter (and never will) and I don't think the Archbishop of Detroit (were Father is a priest) would be too agreeable to that arrangement! The Archdiocese of Detroit is indeed blessed to have a Canon Lawyer like Fr. Czarnota to assist in that very important ministry which requires very long hours and great wisdom. Father Paul has both virtues and much more.

In summary, Fr. Paul while undertaking a grueling task of seeking an advanced degree in Canon Law revived our Religious education program and presented our children with one of the most ingenious child/academic/game programs I have ever seen in my 36 years as a priest. I will never forget the last assembly at St. Joseph before school let out. When Father Paul entered the room the children stood up and chanted for five minutes FATHER PAUL, FATHER PAUL..... I was always told by my sainted spiritual director in the seminary, that when the children come to you with their special devotion, it is a sign you are a "Holy Priest." Yes, Father Paul you are a Holy Priest, a "Good and faithful" a "Priest Servant of God" and you will be sorely missed by Staff, parishioners, and the school community of St. Joseph Regional school. May God bless you Father Paul Czarnota and may He reward you.

Food Pantry 2016: We have had 573 visits to our Food Pantry so far this year. We have registered 42 new families. Summer vacation days increase the need for items like peanut butter, jelly, fruit, cereal, snacks, popcorn, Pop Tarts, crackers, juice, pasta, pasta sauce, canned meat, canned pasta, cookies, paper towels and detergent as well as the usual every-day needs. Many of the children in our families receive free breakfast and lunch during the school year, which is not available to them during the summer months. We truly appreciate your generosity as we continue our attempts to fill so many needs.

Current Pantry Stock: Our supply of most Pantry items with the exception of toilet tissue, tuna, mac 'n' cheese and pasta has dwindled, so we ask you to continue with your usual Pantry donations throughout the summer months. Thank You so much!

Gift Card Donations: We are always in need of ALDI, Costco, CVS, Dollar Tree, Giant, Rite Aid, Safeway, Sam's Club, and Shop Rite Gift Cards in order to keep our Pantry shelves well stocked.
